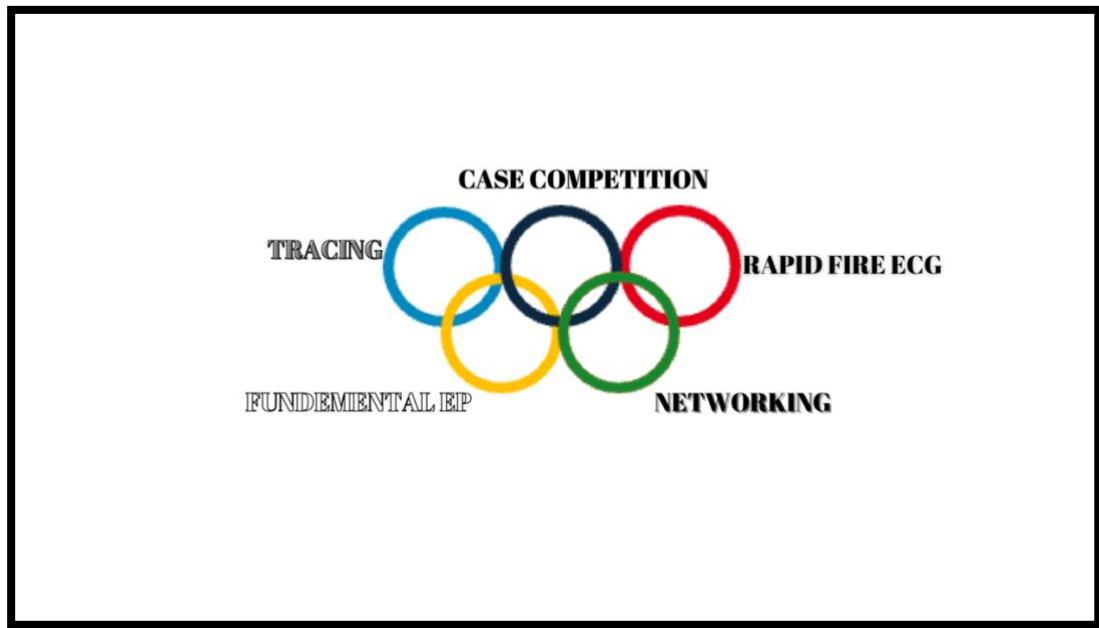




## INTRODUCTION OF TRACEOLYMPICS



### Tracing Competition

**Format:** An account will be created for each participant during registration (via mobile app) to facilitate online voting for multiple-choice questions. At the conclusion of the meeting, participants with the highest scores will be awarded medals.

#### Structure of Each Case:

**Questions:** Participants must answer diagnostic and management-related questions which are European Heart Rhythm Association (EHRA) certification exam format

**Answer Key:** Correct interpretation and explanation.

Five questions (EHRA certification exam standard) will be projected and answered by participant with mobile system in 15 minutes. Then Each question will be explained by faculty in 30 minutes

## **Gladiator Arena Case Competition**

Five educative cases will be selected by organization committee. Participants will present their own challenging cases and defend their case against faculty and audience.

### **Format:**

- Each participant presents one real or simulated case.
- They must provide clinical context, ECG or EP tracings, and key diagnostic challenges.
- The audience and faculty challenge the presenter with questions.
- Winner be selected by the votes of audience

### **Case Structure (for Participants to Follow):**

**Each case should be structured in four key parts:**

#### **Case Introduction (1 minutes)**

- Title: A catchy or intriguing name.
- Patient Information: Age, gender, previous history, symptoms.
- Presenting ECG or EP Findings: Provide initial tracing/images.

#### **Clinical Challenge (3 minutes)**

- Describe the main dilemma or question (e.g., What is the diagnosis? What is the best treatment strategy?).
- Highlight any uncertainties or potential pitfalls.
- If applicable, share additional EP lab findings.

### Learning Points (2minutes)

- Reveal the final diagnosis and outcome of the case.
- Highlight key learning points (e.g., important ECG findings, common mistakes, management pearls).
- Share any relevant literature or guidelines if applicable.

### Audience & Faculty Discussion ( 4 minutes)

- Open the floor for peer and faculty questions.
- The presenter must defend their diagnosis, reasoning, and management approach.
- Faculty can guide the discussion to clarify misconceptions or bring up alternative approaches.

## Rapid Fire ECG Competition:

**Format:** A fast-paced, quiz-style ECG interpretation session. Questions are **multiple-choice**, with limited time (Maximum 1 min) to answer. Participants will see an ECG or a brief case and must choose the correct answer within seconds.

### Structure of Each Question:

- **Brief Patient Scenario:** Age, symptoms, ECG description.
- **Multiple-Choice Question:** Arrhythmia diagnosis or management choice about ECG.
- **Correct Answer with Explanation:** Quick summary of why it is correct. -Explanation section
